Belgic Confession, Article 9, "The Trinity," Part 2

Scripture Lesson:

Lesson Aim	To understand two things: First, what we can learn as we compare and contrast false religions and heresies with the truth of the Word of God. Second, how we know that God is one yet three according to the Scriptures.
Steps to Learning	Read <u>Belgic Confession</u> , <u>Article 9</u> and <u>1 Corinthians 8:4-6</u> . Discuss the sermon and the particulars of the lesson below. It may work best to work through the material over several days or sessions.

Discuss	What are some false religions that deny the Trinity? Judaism and Islam.
	Which false teachers did we discuss in the sermon who are heretics? Marcion (rejected the Old Testament), Manes (false idea of dueling eternal principles), Praxeas (denied personal distinctiveness of the persons), Sabellius (the persons were just modes of God's existence), Samosatenus (Jesus was just a man adopted by God and indwelt by the Logos of God) and Arius (Christ was a created being).
	Which Creeds help us to understand the Trinity? The Apostles', the Nicaean and the Athanasian.
	What Scriptures did we cover that speak to the Trinitarian nature of God? Genesis 1:26, 3:22; Job 38; John chapter 1; Matthew 3:17; Luke 1:35; 1 Corinthians 8:6; 2 Corinthians 13:4.
Bible Reading	Exodus chapters 1-6 [Moses and Israel in Egypt] (covering the great Bible stories)
